Why is punctuality so important?

Good school attendance includes being there on
time. Punctuality is a life skill. The habit of good
punctuality at school will help your child throughout
their education, into adult life and the work place.

Did you know that...

**5 minutes late each day
= 3 days lost over a year**

**10 minutes late each day
= 6.5 days lost over a year**

**15 minutes late each day
= 10 days lost over a year**

**20 minutes late each day
= 13 days lost over a year**

**30 minutes late each day
= 19 days lost over a year**
